Chiral's Story

"Two years into our marriage the abuse increased. My pastor was concerned about the physical abuse, but he encouraged me to stay. My CTPM advocate walked me through it all. She was the literal hands and feet of Jesus to me. Joining a CTPM support group helped me process the pain and restore my soul. Having women who understood and who were a safe place for me to share was significantly helpful to my healing. I didn't feel alone anymore.

"When my car became unsafe to drive, CTPM donated a vehicle, which enabled me to focus on providing food for my four children, which was a struggle. Now that I am safe and healing, my life is calmer. My kids and I enjoy laughing together again. Because of my journey, I decided to become a CTPM advocate and start a support group in my church. I want to stop the generational cycle of abuse from being repeated."


Twenty-one men completed our **G5 Ministry** which provided intervention for men seeking lasting change from using power and control in relationships.

Anna's Story


"Isolation, control, emotional abuse and economic abuse were all normal parts of my marriage for years.



Through my support group leader's help, I've been able to break generational patterns of anxiety and fear that stem from the trauma and abuse of my marriage.
